CiteSmart is an instructional tool that provides students and teachers with a comprehensive understanding of student writing authenticity and use of sources.

CiteSmart Originality Level approximates how much content within a given essay or story was originally created by the student. In order to determine if a document is plagiarized, a teacher should review students' use of source material and citations.

## Originality: 84\%

$84 \%$ represents a high percentage of original student content.

Originality: 6\%
6\% represents a low percentage of original student content.

- A low Originality Score may indicate that students have summarized, quoted or paraphrased source material.
- A low Originality Score may also be a flag for teachers to instruct students on how to properly use and cite source material.

## Examining the Source



By selecting each source separately and clicking "Show comparison," you will be able where the matches are written into the essay and also view matches adjacent to the essay as a whole.

The selected source indicates that $9.2 \%$ of student content is found in the assignment. This percentage accounts for $23.3 \%$ of the content found in the listed document.
